

From the Editor

Throughout my fifty years of evangelism on the road, it has been my privilege to share in ministry with scores of fellow evangelists and song evangelists. In those early years, I was in awe of great pulpiteers such as Dr. Jim Crabtree, Stuart McWhirter, Dr. C. William Fisher, Dr. Edward Lawlor, Dr. Chuck Millhuff, Dr. Richard Strickland, and so many others. I witnessed men and women, anointed and gifted by God, doing the work of an evangelist as they drew the net and altars filled with seekers.

Occasionally, I had the honor of providing music or sharing the pulpit with one of our general superintendents. The honor was intimidating for me until I learned how much they were willing to help and encourage me. Several names come to mind, but today I am thinking of Dr. James Diehl.

As I talk with our current family of evangelists and singers, Dr. Diehl's

name comes up on a regular basis. To this day, he maintains a very heavy schedule of revival, camp meeting, and retreat dates. It appears that he has no plans of slowing down anytime soon! Two years ago, Dr. Diehl was our featured speaker at the annual Evangelists' Homecoming Camp Meeting at Indian Lake Nazarene Campgrounds in Vicksburg, Michigan, over Labor Day weekend. Due to the overwhelming response from our evangelists and camp meeting crowds, Dr. Diehl has agreed to return again this year as our main speaker.

Some of the best encouragement I received early on was to remember, “Only heaven will reveal all that God accomplished through your life and ministry.” (After fifty years on the road, I can attest that knowing you only do what you do because you love Jesus does, in fact, bring a joy and comfort like no other.) Dr. Diehl has exemplified living purely for the joy of loving Jesus.

I received permission from Dr. Diehl to share with you just one of his personal areas of joy, and my particular experience of it. One

December, Beth and I received a hand addressed Christmas card with a fifty-dollar bill tucked inside. It was from Jim and Dorothy Diehl. We were humbled and blessed at the same time. I won't tell you how long ago that was, but eventually I was able to get alone with Dr. Diehl to thank him personally. He explained to me that the Lord had challenged him to establish what he calls his "Barnabas Fund." Dr. Jim shared that he has a real burden to encourage saints who have lost a spouse, those suffering an illness, and evangelists and singers around Christmas time. This list has grown substantially over the years, but Dr. Jim continues to be obedient. God told His servant to do something, and it's clear He has obligated Himself to arrange funding. The Holy Spirit has touched the hearts of many people to support the "Barnabas Fund," and it continues to provide encouragement to the body of Christ. Dr. Jim asked that I emphasize that not one dime goes to him or to his family. He enjoys giving it all away and always looks forward to the next opportunity to empty the fund.

How are you working to bless and encourage others today? You may already have a similar focus of ministry, or maybe Dr. Jim's "Barnabas Fund" turned a light on for you. Jesus gives us some truly great advice when it

comes to giving: "Do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you" (Matthew 6:3-4). If ever there was a time when we need to encourage and be encouraged, it is today. These words from the Master have encouraged me to keep following and serving with joy: "I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you" (John 15:11-12).



I Am Alive Forevermore

Revelation 1:8

“Alive forevermore” are the words that the risen Lord spoke to John while he was banished on the isle that is called Patmos. He declared to John, “I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending.” He is the center and circumference of the plan of the ages. He created the world and all that is therein. He formed humans out of the dust of the ground and breathed into our nostrils the breath of life and we became a living soul. He witnessed humanity’s disobedience and expulsion from the garden. He promised that the seed of the woman would one day come and bruise the head of the serpent. The day that the Incarnation was announced, the angelic choir swung low over the balconies of heaven and sang the song of the nativity over the Judean hillside. For thirty-three years, He walked among us and John said, “we beheld

His glory, the glory of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth” (John 1:14). At the close of His earthly life, Jesus set His face to go to Jerusalem to offer Himself for the sins of the world.

However, crucifixion would lose its meaning without the resurrection: “If Christ be not risen then is our preaching in vain, and your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins” (I Cor. 15:15,17 KJV). Therefore, the incarnation and the resurrection are logical compliments. Paul Rees said: “They represent the vast arch spanning the chasm of death and hell with one end resting on time and the other in eternity.” That’s why Jesus told John, “I am He that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive forevermore.” Following His resurrection, the main theme of Apostolic preaching was

the resurrection of our Lord: "This Jesus has God raised up, whereof we are all witnesses" (Peter's sermon in Acts 3). They were eyewitnesses to the greatest miracle of all time.

The words, "He is not here: for He is risen," is not written of the founder or leader of any other religion. No other religion could testify to a once dead and now living God. If God can bring forth life from the tomb, who would question that He could do anything? While His resurrection is a historical fact, it must become a reality in our hearts and lives. When Paul said that he wanted to "know the power of His resurrection," it was so that he would be enabled to live as He taught us to live. Jesus has made provision in His death and resurrection to break the bonds of sin and to bring us forth in newness of life and call us to live holy and righteous all the days of our lives. Paul wrote in Romans 6:5, "For if we have been planted together in the likeness of His death, we shall be also in the likeness of His resurrection." He then admonished the Colossians that, "if ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God." In heaven, He is our representative before the eternal Throne: "He ever liveth to make intercession for us." As Charles Wesley wrote, "Before the Throne my surety stands—My name is written on His hands."

Through His death and resurrection, Jesus took the sting out of death and victory from the grave. For everyone who receives Him as

their Savior, His resurrection is a guarantee of their resurrection: "But now is Christ risen from the dead and become the first fruits of them that slept." It is because of His resurrection that one day humanity shall come forth from the dead. Their sleeping dust shall rise from all over the world. Paul tells us in I Thessalonians 4: 14-15, "If we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with Him. For this we say unto you by the Word of the Lord, that we which are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep."

Tennyson wrote:

"He Died! And with Him perished all that men hold dear;

Hope lay beside Him in the sepulcher, love grew corpse cold, and all things beautiful died when He died!"

"He Arose! And with Him hope arose, and life and light.

Men said, 'Not Christ, but Death, died yesternight.' And joy and truth and all things virtuous rose when He arose!"

Because He lives, we can indeed face tomorrow with confidence and hope!

Can Christian Holiness Work in a Secular School System?

I'll call him "Tony." As my fellow teacher looked out her window on a spring day, she discovered Tony digging around inside a commercial size recycling container. Not knowing exactly what to do or say, she came to me thinking that since I had a fairly close relationship with Tony, I could inquire about his actions. The next day, I did exactly that: "Tony, why were you digging around in the recycle bin yesterday?" To my shock, he didn't even hesitate in his reply: "You were throwing away textbooks, so I figured I could pawn them for some money." Now, why would a teenager want money? Unfortunately, I must admit that my mind went to the worst of places: drugs. So, I asked. He looked at me for only a moment and replied, "Mrs. Murphy, I need to feed my mom and me." That was the end of the conversation and the beginning of my understanding of the greater call on our lives as children of God.

I am ashamed to admit it, but I have shared this precaution more than once: Don't talk about Christ or bring up the Gospel in public school or you will lose your job. This fallacy that we tell ourselves is the devil's way of keeping the truth that would set the next generation free a secret. Yes, I could lose my job for sharing the love of Jesus Christ, but His love is not limited to a Bible study or a theological debate. His love is shared when you see a need and meet it. During Jesus' earthly ministry, he was found at the bedside of those ailing, by the water with those listening, and healing those who were willing. Tony had a tremendous need that was going unnoticed, and the power of the Holy Spirit convicted me in that very conversation and compelled me to do more. That summer the plans were put into place to start a backpack program that would feed any child or family in need at the local alternative high school. Jesus listened to His Father, thanked His Father for his power, and did what His Father asked. We, too, must be willing to break the chains of the devil and do as the Father commands.

Matthew 25:35-40 says, "For I was hungry, and you fed me. I was thirsty, and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger, and you invited me into your home. I was naked, and you gave me clothing. I was sick, and you cared for me. I was in prison, and you visited me." Then

these righteous ones will reply, 'Lord, when did we ever see you hungry and feed you? Or thirsty and give you something to drink? Or a stranger and show you hospitality? Or naked and give you clothing? When did we ever see you sick or in prison and visit you?' And the King will say, 'I tell you the truth, when you did it to one of the least of these my brothers and sisters, you were doing it to me!'"

"When did I ever see you?" The question of Christian holiness really comes down to this question from the righteous ones. Are we taking the time to see those around us the way that our Heavenly Father does? Are we then willing to meet their needs as God has gifted us to do? The lie that many believe in the public school system is really just a symptom of fear. I have gone from working through that backpack program to praying publicly at year end celebrations. God is a triumphant God, and when we are willing to step out from what we fear and trust the gospel for its truth, then the truth will set us free. If there were ever a venue that needed to see Christ's love on display, it is our public school sector. It is time for followers of Jesus Christ to rise up, bear their cross, and follow Him triumphantly. Our reward is not here on earth but rather in Heaven. So, if I must lose my job for standing firm on the gospel, then I must lose my job. True love, like that which Jesus was spreading throughout cities while here on earth, is still here today because of the Advocate, the Holy Spirit. Let us hold tight to the promise that is written in John 14:12-13: "I tell you the truth, anyone who believes in me will do the same works I have done, and even greater works, because I am going to be with my Father. Ask for anything in my name, and I will do it, so that the Son can bring glory to the Father."

I first talked with Tony about his life needs nearly six years ago. Jesus used that encounter to call me deeper. The moment we connect with the One who created us is the first step in a lifelong journey, as we learn how Jesus wants to use us to make his Kingdom come here on earth. Jesus' plan is not for us to remain silent in the face of hurt and suffering. Rather, He calls us to confidently and boldly speak up and act on behalf of those who need to know the true meaning of love, Jesus Christ. Will you heed the call regardless of the consequence?

You are loved, chosen, and adopted. . .because He wanted to!



America's Bishop: The Life of Francis Asbury

Author: Dr. Darius L. Salter

It is an extraordinary benefit to be gripped by a book that throughout its pages consistently informed, inspired, encouraged, challenged, and motivated me in my specific calling as an itinerant evangelist. That is the favor granted to me by Dr. Darius Salter through his historical description of Asbury's life in this new biography, *America's Bishop: The Life of Francis Asbury*.

Dr. Salter's perspective is credibly enhanced by the numerous annotations from Asbury's own Journal and Letters. As I read, I frequently felt as though I was present in history: lodging in someone's barn, riding on horseback on some remote Indian trail, hearing Asbury preach in a rural log cabin, or watching him lead the Methodist Annual Conference in a sophisticated New England church.

For me, the big takeaway was the inescapably convicting example of Asbury's grit, passion, and perseverance in the Vital Cause. On page 358, Salter writes, "For both migrating Americans and Asbury, the road always lay ahead. The bishop issued an invitation, 'Follow me.' One cannot follow someone who quits moving, so Asbury never stopped."

Dr. Salter's book reloads an evangelist's heart with fresh zeal to pack another suitcase, travel another mile, approach another pulpit, and give another invitation.

Dr. James Diehl

The 1993 General Assembly of the Church of the Nazarene in Indianapolis, Indiana elected Dr. James Diehl to the Board of General Superintendents.

In 2009, after he served 16 years in this role, the 27th General Assembly in Orlando, Florida bestowed on him the honor of general superintendent emeritus status.

A love for ministry has always been at the center of his heart. He first demonstrated this in his pastorates in Iowa and Georgia. As pastor at Oskaloosa, Iowa, he conducted live radio programs for seven years and led



his church to develop a weekly television broadcast. He came to the general superintendency from his senior pastor position at First Church of the Nazarene in Denver, Colorado. Dr. Diehl is a prolific writer of numerous articles that have appeared in the Herald of Holiness, Holiness Today, Preacher's Magazine, Bread, World Mission, The Holiness Digest, Perspective, and others.

He has a great love for education. He is a graduate of Olivet Nazarene University and in 1990 Northwest Nazarene University conferred on him a Doctor of Divinity degree in recognition of his outstanding achievements. His passion for education has led him to serve on the boards of trustees at MidAmerica Nazarene University (MNU), Nazarene Theological Seminary, Nazarene Bible College, and Northwest Nazarene University. He also served as chairman of the Board of Regents at Northwest Nazarene University. In 2011, the Board of

Trustees at MNU invited Dr. Diehl to serve as interim president of the University—a position he held for seven months while they conducted a search for a new president. At the close of his service at the University, the trustees presented James H. Diehl with the Lifetime Achievement Award.

Dr. Diehl married the love of his life, Dorothy, and together they raised four children. They have seven grandchildren and five great grandchildren. The Diehls make their home in Lakewood, Colorado.

As Paul described his ministry to Timothy in 2 Timothy 1:11, so Dr. Diehl describes his calling—to be a pastor, a preacher, and an administrator. While laying down the administrative call, his passion continues with an ongoing preaching ministry from a pastor's heart. He frequently speaks at camp meetings, college revivals, district ministerial retreats, district lay retreats, zone crusades, and international events.

We could tell that God's Spirit had ministered to this wayfaring stranger on whom the stuff of life has placed an almost unbearable burden. Glory to God!

A Tribute to Rev. Howard Rickey

THE EVANGELISTS' PERSPECTIVE

When I think about Howard Rickey's life and legacy, two things immediately come to mind: love and loyalty. Proverbs 17:17 says, "A friend loves at all times!" How true this was of Howard. He loved and was loyal to his Lord, his family, his church, and his friends. Outside of his family and some close friends, I knew him as well as anyone. I saw firsthand his love and loyalty, and the joyful witness which he shared freely with everyone he met. Howard's life was a light and blessing to many, many people!

Howard was the pastor that first led me to accept Jesus as my Lord and Savior at the altar of my childhood church, Detroit Bethel Church of the Nazarene, in April 1972. At that moment, we were bonded in Christ and he became my spiritual father in the faith. I cannot begin to find the words to tell you just how much he means to me. Howard was my pastor, mentor, counselor, shepherd, prayer intercessor, and without a doubt, one of the best friends I have ever had in my life. The Lord knows that if I had to ask one person to pray for me, it would have been Howard! Trust me, the man knew how to pray, and when he prayed he "touched heaven." Anyone who knew him knows just how true this is! In my 41 years of serving as a Tenured Evangelist in the Church of the Nazarene, and in the last 8 years of serving as the National Public Relations Representative for the Nazarene Bible College, I can honestly say I have never met anyone who was more of a "people person" than Howard. And I've met thousands of folks! There's an old saying that "He didn't know any strangers," and this epitomized Howard. Whether it was a waitress

or waiter, someone in an airport, or someone at a football game, he always reached out to others and would witness to them about Jesus. I saw him do this over and over again.

A few months ago, Howard called and told me that he was diagnosed with non-operable pancreatic cancer and was given six to nine months left to live. The cancer spread rapidly, and on Monday, March 25th 2019, he took his last breath here on earth and his first breath in Heaven. Howard is now with His Lord, his family, and all of his dear friends who have gone on before. They have welcomed him into his eternal reward! I am so thankful that a few days before he passed we were able to have a brief visit on the phone. I said, "I love you, Howard." He replied, "I love you too, Haines!" Later when his son John informed me of his imminent home-going, all I could say was, "Well, when he leaves, he's taking a part of me with him!" Thankfully, because of the hope of Eternal Life in Heaven that we have in Christ, it's just "so long," and not goodbye.

Until we meet again, I will cherish all the wonderful memories of our being together at numerous General Assemblies, evangelism conferences, retreats, revivals, and camp meetings. We shared precious moments of laughing together, crying together, praying together, and praising God together, not to

mention all the wonderful times we shared with each other's families. He was one of God's special gifts to me, and I cannot imagine where I would be today without the connection we had together in Christ and the church.

I am really going to miss him. Truth is, I already do. Since his passing, there is a great old gospel song that I have been thinking about called Precious Memories: "Precious Memories, how they linger; How they ever flood my soul; In the stillness, of the midnight; precious sacred scenes unfold." Thank you, Lord, for the day you brought Rev. Howard Rickey into my life. I will be forever grateful that You did!


